Instructions:

- 1. Find the first person's relationship to the common ancester by looking across the top (unmarked) row of boxes.
- 2. Find the second person's relationship to the common ancester by looking down the left most (unmarked) column of boxes.
- 3. Read down and across until you reach the box where the two intersect. That box will show the relationship.

Example:

- 1. Daniel is the common ancester
- 2. Bill is Daniel's Great-Great Grandson, so you choose column 4.
- 3. Yvonne is Daniel's Great-Great Granddaughter, so you choose row 4.
- 4. Follow down the column 4 and across the row 4 until they intersect.
- 5. They intersect at the box "3rd Cousin", so Bill and Yvonne are Third Cousins.
